
Before the Journey Began...

The leaders of Ta'if rejected the message and ordered some people to chase out and hurt him our Prophet **.




WHERE ARE THEY GOING?


In the past, people travelled through the desert together as a 'caravan' with camels carrying their goods.

They were not as quick as the Buraq! Can you do this Puzzle quicker than the Buraq?




