



LOVE FOR MASJID AL-AQSA




VISITING MASJID AL-AQSA I love Masjid Al-Aqsa

History of Masjid Al-Aqsa

Prophet Adam was commanded by Allah to build the Ka'bah. Forty years later, Prophet Adam was told to build Masjid Al-Aqsa.

These were the first two sacred places of worship dedicated to the worship of Allah.

Over time, people forgot about Allah and stopped worshipping Him. They began to worship idols and other things. Both Masajids became ruins.

After a long time, Allah sent another great Prophet, Ibrahim who rebuilt the Ka'bah and Masjid Al-Aqsa. He rebuilt the Ka'bah on the original foundations and also rebuilt Masjid Al-Aqsa in its original place.

Ibrahim And rebuilt the Ka'bah with his first son, Ismael. Ismael And been living here with his mother since he was a baby. Allah had gifted them Zamzam water and a town called Makkah had developed here.

Ibrahim's second son, Ishaq helped rebuild Masjid Al-Aqsa. Allah sent many prophets to Masjid Al-Aqsa to look after it and pray there.

So there were communities in both these sacred places, praying to Allah.

Prophet Yusuf was a son of Prophet Yaqub . As a youngster, Yusuf had been thrown into the well by his brothers. He had been rescued by travellers and taken to Egypt. He was sold into slavery then went to prison as an innocent man. Later on, he was given an important role in Egypt during the difficult years of famine.

During this time, his brothers came to Egypt for food and supplies. Yusuf forgave them and soon his brothers and father came and settled in Egypt.

As time went on, there was no one to look after Masjid Al-Aqsa and pray in it. Soon it became a ruin and forgotten about. The people that

had lived there from the earliest time, the Palestinians, continued to live on these lands.

After many years, the political leader of Egypt called the Pharaoh became angry with the offspring of Yaqoob , the Jews. He made them into slaves and forced them to work for him. The Pharaoh was a very cruel tyrant.

After a while, Allah sent Musa to free the Jews and take them back to Jerusalem and Masjid Al-Aqsa.

When they got there, they refused to fight the native Palestinians who lived there. The Jews spent forty years in the desert.

Soon a brave youngster, Prophet Dawud , came and he helped to fight and take over Jerusalem. He then started to work very hard to rebuild Masjid Al-Agsa

After Dawud passed away, his son, Prophet Sulaiman finished rebuilding Masjid Al-Aqsa. Sulaiman was a great prophet and Allah had given him the power to control animals and Jinn. He used the Jinn to help him build Masjid Al-Aqsa.

Many years passed with people praying and looking after Masjid Al-

Aqsa. There were many great prophets including Prophet Isa during this time.

After Prophet Isa's time, Masjid Al-Aqsa was destroyed by the Romans and again became ruins. The Romans used Masjid Al-Aqsa as a dumping ground for rubbish.

The Romans banned the Jews from entering Jerusalem for many centuries.

When Prophet Muhammad scame, he advised the Muslims to look after Masjid Al-Aqsa, to protect it, and pray in it.

A few years after Prophet
Muhammad spassed away, the
Sahabah went to Jerusalem and
took over it. They cleaned the
rubbish from the grounds of Masjid
Al-Aqsa and built a Masjid on the
grounds.

The Muslims were kind-hearted and allowed the banished Jews to come into Jerusalem. The Christians were also allowed to live and worship in Jerusalem.
